How to create a word sleuth game

1. Enter the title of your word search
2. Enter the size of your word search (15x15 is best)
3. Choose how often you want to share letters – ‘occasionally’
4. Choose output type – I chose html
5. Type in your words
6. Check your spelling
7. Hit print – finished!
